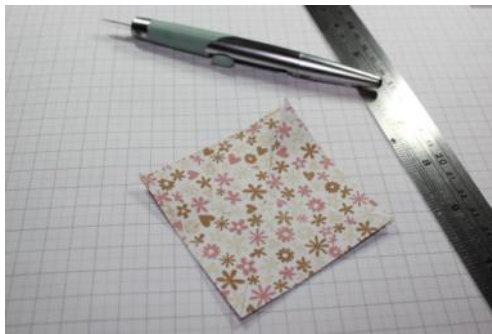
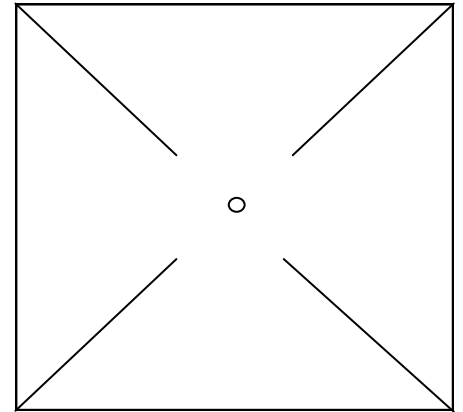


Patterns | Pinwheel

For use on any paper craft project

Variations to Try

- Tear out your pattern instead of cutting
- Add a flower to the centre with a brad
- Ink the edges so that your pieces stand out
- Flatten the folds to make a flat pinwheel for your layout
- Try using different sized pinwheels in a group on your layout
- Try folding your pieces to the centre in the opposite direction
- Experiment with different materials like fabric, wide ribbon or mulberry papers
- Why not try making a round one?? Think outside the square!



Cut a square of paper I have used 3"x 3", double sided is good to use as you will see both sides. Use a centring ruler to mark the centre of the square. Use a metal ruler and craft knife to make 4 cuts on the diagonal of the square as per the diagram above. Stop about 1/4" from the centre mark as you don't want to cut your square in half.



Put a small amount of adhesive in the centre of the square to hold down the corners as you are working. Then take each corner and fold it over to the pencil mark in the centre of the square. Repeat for all 4 corners.



Once you have all corners adhered to the centre, you can finish it off with a flower, brad, gemstone or any other embellishment in the centre.
